Presenter:



Marc Brackett, Ph.D., is director of the Yale Center for Emotional Intelligence. He is also a senior research scientist in psychology and faculty fellow in the Edward Zigler Center in Child Development and Social Policy at Yale University. He cocreated RULER and has developed two university courses on emotional intelligence. As recipient of the Joseph E. Zins Award for his research on social and emotional learning, this grant-funded research focuses on (1) the role of emotional intelligence in learning, decision making, relationship quality, and mental health, (2) the measurement of emotional intelligence, and (3) the influences of emotional intelligence training on student and educator effectiveness, bullying prevention, and school climate. Marc also is working with Facebook on a large-scale research project designed to both prevent and decrease online bullying

and serves on Lady Gaga's Born this Way Foundation Board. He is the author of 100 scholarly publications.
